

# Cardiovascular Rehabilitation Stakeholder Forum #5

Meeting Summary Notes | June 27, 2023; 3:00 - 4:00PM

**GROUPS INVITED:** Approximately 60 stakeholders joined the call with invitations extended to the CorHealth Cardiac Leadership Council, Cardiovascular Rehabilitation Programs, the Rehabilitative Care Alliance, Ministry of Health Partners, and Heart and Stroke Foundation Leadership.

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

#### Welcome

Erin McPherson opened the meeting with a Land Acknowledgement.

Dr. Karen Harkness and Dr. Paul Oh provided introductory remarks and reviewed the meeting objectives:

- To review updated CR data collection results to date
- To continue the dialogue and activity supporting a progressive approach to measure, monitor, and report on the status of outpatient Cardiovascular Rehabilitation in Ontario
- To share experiences and facilitate dialogue on the current activities and models of delivery for cardiovascular rehabilitation (including virtual, in-person and hybrid)

# **Provincial CR Measurement & Reporting Initiative: Updated Results**

- Initial cardiac cohort, post PCI and post CABG +/- Valve surgery subgroup data points for FY 2022/23 Q4 were presented.
- The ratio of total referrals: total number of clinical meaningful encounters for the initial cardiac cohort ranges between 55 and 63% since the beginning of data collection (October 2021) to April 1, 2023 (slide 9)
- This ratio is higher for the subgroup post CABG +/- Valve surgery (73%) (slide 10) versus post PCI (57%) (slide 11)

### **Discussion points**

- What is the ratio of referral: intake we should aspire to as a province?
- What is an acceptable gap between referral and intake?
- Comment- Some programs experiencing more referrals with fixed capacity-contributing to longer wait list and people then decline so ratio decreases.
